Nairobi

Amboseli National Park

[Amboseli National Park](#) is the second most popular wildlife area in Kenya, famous for its large population of over 1,000 resident elephants including some of the last great tuskers.

The park is a photographer's paradise for its scenic beauty with the breathtaking views of the world's highest free-standing mountain, the snow-capped **Kilimanjaro**.

The Amboseli National Park is characterized by lush green wetlands that in this otherwise dry area make the Amboseli National Park one of the best wildlife-viewing areas in East Africa, attracting over 600 species of birds including 47 types of raptors as well as the African iconic mammals like the elephant, the cape buffalo, the lion and the cheetah.



Guided bush walks & birding with experienced resident Masai guides are activities that should not be missed.

Meru National Park

The Meru National Park is a rugged and remote area, it also incorporates a thriving rhino sanctuary, making Meru one of the prime destinations to see rhinos in their natural habitat.

The park is famous for large elephant herds, lions and birdlife that is extraordinarily colourful and abundant with over 400 species of birds.

Activities include nature walks, fishing in the streams and game drives.





Masai Mara National Reserve

The Masai Mara National Reserve in Kenya is a world famous safari destination for its astounding numbers of wildlife and, of course, for the **Great Migration** that in this area occurs from July to October when over 1.3 million wildebeests and zebras cross from the [Serengeti](#) to the Maasai Mara in search of greener pastures.

The vast fertile plains are the natural stage for an incredible density of game, with both resident and transient populations of lions, leopards, cheetahs and hyenas, the reserve has been classified among the ***Seven Natural Wonders of the World***.
